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THROUGH A LANGUAGE MIRED IN INTERLINGUAL INSURRECTION, SONIC WARFARE NEGOTIATES THE FRAUGHT REALITY OF GENERATIVE ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE, LARGE LANGUAGE MODELS AND THEIR IMPACT ON CONTEMPORARY SOCIO-PHILOSOPHICAL, LINGUISTIC AND POLITICAL ETHOS. HIGHLIGHTING HOW WHEN PRESENCE IS RELATIONAL AND THERE IS NO FIXED, LOCATABLE TRUTH, WHEN EVERYTHING IS HAUNTED BY REPETITION, SUBSTITUTIONS, VEILED SURVEILLANCE, WITHIN A SCROLLING COROLLARY OF CODED COMMUNICATION, IT WRYLY EXAMINES THE PUBLIC CONVERSATION ON ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT GLOBAL CHALLENGES FACING THE WORLD TODAY

ALSO REFERRED TO AS ACOUSTIC WEAPONRY, "SONIC WARFARE," IS THE USE OF INTENSE, DIRECTED SOUND WAVES CAUSING VERTIGO, NAUSEA AND DISORIENTATION. IN THE WAY NAN GOLDIN DRAWS ON THE METAPHOR OF THE STENDHAL SYNDROME, A PSYCHOSOMATIC CONDITION OF DIZZINESS, CONFUSION OR EVEN HALLUCINATIONS TRIGGERED BY EXPOSURE TO INTENSE BEAUTY, SONIC WARFARE EMITS ULTRA-HIGH FREQUENCY BLASTS OF VIBRATORY INFRASONIC PSYCHOLOGICAL "WARFARE" VERTIGINOUSLY REORIENTING US TOWARDS NEW SOCIO-SEMANTIC- PERCEPTIONS OF MEANING AND BEING.

Sonic Warfare (2026), just through its title, ignites in the mind of the prospective reader the collective gloom and angst of a culture in the midst of unprecedented political chaos and a changing technological environment becoming ever more dominated by AI, and as the author hints, quantum. Adeena Karasick, Ph.D, www.adeenkarasick.net is a NY based Canadian poet, performer, cultural theorist and media artist and the author of 18 books of award-winning poetry and poetics.
